Cat Depot has launched a new innovative program to help senior cats get adopted. The program is called SOS


(Save Our Seniors). Cats, like people, are living




longer, and we are now facing a national dilemma. Many shelters have age restrictions, believing that older cats are difficult to place or unadoptable.

CAT DEPOT EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CDERT)

Natural and man-made disasters are inescapable. In 2005, Hurricane Katrina opened our eyes to the need for emergency trained animal responders. As a result of that horrific event, CDERT was formed.

Currently, Cat Depot has 33 trained staff and volunteer responders, which is not enough. Should a natural disaster happen in our backyard, only emergency trained and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) certified responders will be allowed to help.

Florida is the only state to have a FEMA approved training organization. Please attend a FL SARC (Florida State Animal Response Coalition) certification class, hosted by Cat Depot.

- April 8 or August 12: Level 1 Awareness (needed to deploy)
- May 20, 21: Level 2 Operations (advanced level)

In 2016, Cat Depot rescued 189 cats and kittens through deployment or transfer from other organizations. Deployment means helping cats who are in need of emergency care.

Cat Depot is an approved rescue team for the ASPCA. Under their banner, we deployed a medical team to New York to assist 600 cats who required immediate critical care.

2016 was a busy year for the Rose Durham Cat Care Clinic. We performed 1,000+ free spays and neuters through Cat Depot's Community Cat Care Program. We also celebrated our second birthday on November 17. Our dedicated medical team worked tirelessly in what was once the shelter's garage. This beehive of busyness has nearly doubled the number of cats treated from the previous year.
